The African Studies curriculum entails an exploration of Africa through an experiential learning model that engages you actively, ensuring that you become a manager of your own learning.



## HOW TEACHERS TEACH


Learning at The Regent College is both demanding and fun.

#### RESIDENTIAL LIFE

Boarding at The Regent College balances structure with freedom. You are accommodated in twin rooms, all ensuite, within a flat. Each flat is equipped with a kitchenette where you can bake or make light snacks and basic meals. All flats have a common area with TV/DSTV, gaming equipment, and laundry facilities.

The homely atmosphere established by experienced mentors and houseparents facilitates the development of strong bonds of friendship as you share experiences with your flat mates and support each other.

Weekly boarding is allowed, and weekend exeats given if requested for in advance.

Weekend outings to the supermarket or cinema and other activities such as movie nights and sporting activities are scheduled.







- Lights out must be observed so early sleepers are not disadvantaged. However, if you want to study late you can do so in the living area.
- Laptops and phones are allowed throughout the weekend, but a curfew imposed during the week to ensure sufficient time is given to study.
- ▶ Students are allowed to bring in their own wi-fi device.
- There is no provision for house wear, so you are allowed to wear mufti at 'home'.
- Residential Staff are available 24/7 to mentor and supervise boarders.

### STUDENT GOVERNMENT

Student Council Elections hold in October.

Student Leaders are elected to represent student interests and to serve as a mediating body between students and the management of the College.
